

Library Policies

CIRCULATION

Your DeVry ID is your library card. You may borrow as many items as you need. Books, DVDs and Videos may be checked out for 2 weeks. You can renew your materials online by clicking the "Renew Books Online" link on the library webpage.

FINES

The library charges overdue fines and fees for lost or damaged materials. Books and magazines acquire \$.25 per day. DVDs and Videos acquire \$1.00 per day. You can renew items via the library webpage, by calling the library, sending an e-mail, or bringing the items by the library.

DATABASE ACCESS

All DeVry **undergraduate students** in Missouri have access to a DeVry-Kansas City Student E-Mail Account. <http://acad.kc.devry.edu> The username and password fields will use the same login information you use to access computers in the labs and classrooms.

About the Library

The James E. Lovan Library is located in the DeVry University Building at 11224 Holmes Road Kansas City, MO. It was renovated in 2004 to better serve students. The library was dedicated in honor of James E. Lovan, an Engineering Technology Professor at the university from 1945-1974.

The library is available for use by all DeVry University students, faculty, and staff. In addition to the Kansas City Campus, it serves DeVry University Centers located in Downtown Kansas City, St. Louis, and Minnesota.

The library is open six days a week to serve students during the semester. Shorter hours are observed when classes are not in session.

The library staff consists of professional librarians and student information specialists dedicated to providing the highest level of service.

Web Voyage is the library catalog. It can be accessed through the library webpage. It provides access to thousands of items in the Kansas City Library and also to approximately 250,000 books throughout the DeVry University Library system. Many of these items can be made available for students within one or two weeks.



Proquest provides access to more than 9,000 periodicals and newspapers, many updated daily and containing full-text articles from across the disciplines.



Faulkner Advisory on Computer and Communications Technologies (FACCTS) offers comprehensive coverage of the full spectrum of computer systems, software, networking, and telecom technologies - including trends, vendor profiles, and product solutions.



Check out the new way to read books electronically, using **netLibrary**. This collection of 11,000+ volumes includes classic works of fiction, speeches, government documents and other electronic texts. Create a user account from any campus computer and then you can access the database from any computer, anywhere!



Hoover's Online database offers comprehensive coverage of over 12 million public, private and non-US companies and over 300 industries. The information is compiled from thousands of sources including Dun & Bradstreet, Mergent, magazines, newspapers, and industry journals.



CorpTech contains detailed profiles on America's 50,000+ public and private manufacturers and developers of technology products including smaller, privately held companies. Seventeen high-tech industries are covered from telecommunications to factory automation, computer hardware to computer software, and defense to biotech. **This database is only available from computers on the Kansas City campus.**



The library's Safari collection includes hundreds of technical e-books available in full text covering programming, networking, business, artificial intelligence, graphics, software engineering, and more. This amazing product supports searching for full text or code fragments.



Encyclopedia Britannica Online to search its encyclopedia online and an Internet directory that includes more than 300,000 links to Web sites selected, rated, and reviewed by Britannica editors.

Library Features

Interlibrary Loan Service

The library features an excellent Interlibrary Loan program that can provide access to materials from across the nation, typically within a two week period.

Computers

The library is equipped with 15 student computers. Students with laptop computers may plug their machines into the powered tables.

Copy Machine:
